

The ULCT Resolutions Process: Where Legislation Begins

What do the Land Use Development and Management Act rewrite bill, the RDA reauthorization bill, and the local option transportation funding bill all have in common? They started with a ULCT Resolution.

At the upcoming ULCT Annual Convention, September 14-16, 2016, ULCT members will have a chance to set priorities for the 2017 legislative session. Resolutions provide a way for ULCT members to create a unified effort to tackle community issues at the legislature.

The process works as follows:

- ULCT members submit resolutions to ULCT staff
- ULCT staff prepares the resolutions for the ULCT Legislative Policy Committee to consider on Tuesday, September 13, 2016
- After LPC considers the resolutions, then the ULCT membership will consider the resolutions during the business session on Friday, September 16, 2016

In the past the LPC has considered resolutions on a wide variety of issues including taxation, outdoor advertising, transportation funding, impact fees, affordable housing, school crossing guards, and redevelopment agencies. The more input we receive, the better individual concerns can be addressed.
