



Open & Public Meetings Act

- Title 52 Chapter 4 of the Utah Code
- Defines a meeting as being a convening of a public body when a quorum is present
- Meetings include workshops, executive sessions and it does not matter if the meeting is held in person or by means of electronic communications
- Reasons for closing a public meeting are very narrow
 - discussion of the character, professional competence, or physical or mental health of an individual
 - strategy sessions to discuss collective bargaining
 - strategy sessions to discuss pending or reasonably imminent litigation
 - strategy sessions to discuss the purchase, exchange, or lease of real property
 - discussion regarding deployment of security personnel, devices, or systems
 - investigative proceedings regarding allegations of criminal misconduct

Open & Public Meetings Act

- Requirements for public notice
 - 24 hours in advance
 - Published to public notice website
- An audio recording must be made and minutes must be kept
 - These must also be published to the public notice website
- David Church knows all!

Government Records Access & Management Act

- Title 63G Chapter 2 of the Utah Code
- GRAMA defines what a record is and establishes the criteria for accessing government records
- Public record means a record that is not private, controlled, or protected and is prepared, owned, received or retained by the governmental entity
- Specific records are deemed private, controlled, or protected
- All based on balancing tests between public interest v. personal privacy or v. significant government interest
 - Federal regulations (HIPAA, FERPA, etc.)

Government Records Access & Management Act

- Response time
 - 10 business days
 - 5 business days if expedited response is requested
 - More time for extraordinary circumstances
- Retention schedules
 - Allowed to set own retention schedules for how long to keep most records
 - Without your own retention schedule, you default to the State Records Committee schedule
- Fee schedules
 - Set process for copies, hard drives, etc.
 - Allowed to charge for the time of the lowest paid employee that is capable of fulfilling the request
 - Fee waivers can be requested

Transparency in Government Act

- Title 63A Chapter 3
- Creates Utah Transparency Advisory Board & Utah Public Finance Website
- Participating entities must upload transactional financial data for public viewing
- As of 2016 all local governments **regardless of budget size** must participate
- Darrell Swensen, Transparency Coordinator at the Utah State Division of Finance is your go-to-guy!
