**Monday, September 21st—Mobile Tours**

- 1:00PM—3:00PM    **Visit Historic Spring City**  
 Travel back in time and tour Spring City. Also known as “Little Denmark”, Spring City is widely considered the best preserved example of a 19th Century Pioneer Village. It is one of just two cities in the United States to have its entire city limits listed as a historic district on the National Register of History Places.  
 Mayor Cynthia Allred DeGrey will lead the tour and is a lifelong resident. Learn about Spring City’s art community and visit Horseshoe Mountain Pottery. Also see Town Hall, peek inside the beautiful Rock Chapel, historic D.U.P. Museums, and possible home tours. Mayor DeGrey, will also discuss the new 700 acre multi-purpose reservoir that will benefit their city. Remember to bring a few water bottles to capture free, sparkling water.
- 2:00PM—3:30PM    **Holladay, UT: Holladay City Tour**  
 Tour Holladay City’s City Hall/Park redevelopment, Village Plaza and overview of infrastructure changes. The tour will also highlight housing, public process, the SoHo Food Truck Park and upcoming proposals in, and around the area. Learn about Holladay City’s Tree Committee, its purpose and goals.
- 2:00PM—3:00PM    **North Salt Lake, UT: City of North Salt Lake Town Center Master Plan**  
 The mobile tour will highlight the implementation of the City of North Salt Lake Town Center Master Plan, including future implementation of a BRT line, redevelopment projects along Highway 89 from I-15 off ramp to 350 N, including mixed use developments Village Station, City’s Edge, Williamsburg, Towne Plaza and NSL City Center, as well as the major redevelopment planned for Hatch Park. Learn how the city is creating a vibrant center and implementing the plan and the lessons learned about development agreements.

**Tuesday, September 22nd—Mobile Tours**

- 9:00AM—10:30AM    **Salt Lake City, UT: Bicycle tour of Salt Lake City’s active transportation facilities**  
 Salt Lake City has implemented several types of bicycle facilities to enable greater ease in traveling the city by bicycle. Individuals will experience different bicycle infrastructure in an urban environment, with an emphasis on high comfort facilities, in an effort to answer the question, “Would you ride your bike here?”
- 9:00AM—10:00AM    **Layton, UT: Davis North Water Treatment Plant**  
 Weber Basin Water Conservancy District will be highlighting the Davis North Water Treatment Plant which services drinking water Weber and Davis counties. Tour attendees will also be shown the newly built Water Efficiency Research Center and the remodeled Learning Garden.
- 9:30AM—10:30AM    **Ogden, UT: Monarch Tour**  
 Take a behind-the-scenes tour of The Monarch with Thaine Fischer, Managing Planner. After a massive historic renovation, The Monarch opened on 25th Street in November 2019. The collaborative environment is where artists, creative businesses and makers of all types can connect, inspire, and create together in the heart of Ogden’s Nine Rails Creative District. Throughout the pandemic, the artists have shown to be the greatest strength to the enterprise. All 41 studios are full and there is a robust wait list for studio space openings.
- 10:00AM—11:00AM    **South Salt Lake: Prep60 Aqueduct Control Structure in South Salt Lake**  
 The tour of the Aqueduct control structure in South Salt Lake Valley will feature three massive sleeve valves that reduce the pressure of water coming into the Salt Lake Valley from the Provo River.
- 10:00AM—12:00PM    **Duchesne County: Strawberry River Emergency Watershed Protection**  
 Tour the Duchesne County’s Strawberry River Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) project that is underway to restore the river after the 2018 Dollar Ridge Fire. Tour given by Mike Lefler, Fire & Emergency Management Director and Eric Major, PE Roosevelt Office Manager.
- 11:00AM—11:45AM    **Ogden, UT: Utah Energy Wise Communities Project**  
 The Energy Wise Ogden Strategic Implementation Plan was adopted by the city to reduce energy waste and improve resilience across all sectors of the city. The plan lays out goals, strategies, and timeliness to significantly reduce energy waste in Ogden’s municipal operations, businesses, and residential areas. - 12:00PM—12:30PM    **Ogden, UT: “Make Ogden” - Ogden’s New Downtown Master Plan**  
 New housing and public infrastructure projects.

Weber State University is a Top 10 Finalist in the 2020 Department of Energy Solar Decathlon collegiate competition to design and build a Net-Zero energy home. Students from the Department of Construction &amp; Building Sciences make up the senior project team representing the programs of Building Design &amp; Construction, Interior Design, and Construction Management. The home is designed to make the "True Cost of Ownership" affordable to occupants by nearly eliminating energy bills. It is estimated that the energy costs to operate the home will be just over \$120 annually.
